A young pastor planting a new church in the department of Yoro, and a member of Roca de Refugio working with families and children in villages about 30 minutes from the capital have something in common. They are some of several people who have taken our studies and ran with them.

We produce several different series of discovery Bible studies on laminated cards. They are designed to get small groups of people reading and talking about the Bible. Just last month we met with people from three very different churches that are interested in using our materials. We want to see a large harvest and that means recruiting seed sowers from many different places. These people take our studies beyond our oversight or control. However the seed they sow and the disciple they make grow the Kingdom of God.

#### Christmas at Loma de Luz

The Loma de Luz Hospital gives a Christmas banquet to their employees every year. This is one of Rony Moncada's new responsibilities as hospital administrator. Cinthia, Rony's wife, enlisted Teri, Lucy and Oscar (hospital counselors) to help with the banquet

this year. We Rileys helped with music, transportation, decorations and assembling the gift baskets. The message of Christ was preached, as some of the employees have yet to follow Jesus.

Over 30 families and their neighbors enjoyed old and new songs about the birth of our Deliverer and King Jesus Christ. These joyful processions present a great contrast to the dead end party scene for the youth. Accompanied by guitars, sleigh bells and all kinds of percussion, we all enjoyed singing in the streets of Honduras about the birth of the One born to save us all.

# First "Fogatas" on the North Coast

Teroes from the books of Daniel and Esther trod La soccer field on a Saturday night late last year. Over 80 youth from the five communities that are near Hospital Loma de Luz, arrived on time to play games, practice and perform Bible dramas and make new friends. We actually lit a *fogata*, [campfire], on the beach but there was just too much mud and too many youth to make the trek feasible. We really were not prepared for the turn out to be so high. Rony/Cinthia, Heather, Joe/ Cortney, Belinda, several missionary kids and a visiting missionary, Miguel worked hard along side the Rileys and a few church members to make the night special. The second Fogata, postponed three weeks because of the rains, will be kindled today. We have enlisted the help of more Loma de Luz missionary families and singles. Here is the twist, we Riley's won't be there, as we are in Tegus getting the mission house at the retreat center ready for our first teem. The theme is "Against the Current". We hope to encourage the youth who come with the stories of Caleb and Rehab from the pages of Judges.





November 13th this second church plant celebrated its 16th anniversary. Church leaders worked very hard to make it a very special day for the church. A church across town was invited to share in the festivities. Special music from the visiting church, dramas and a delicious potluck dinner made for a memorable day. Jim preached. Jeni and Jimmy both played and sang in the church band.

Roca de Refugio has come a long way since that first meeting sixteen years ago in our living room. Our children have grown up in that church. Several friends have gotten married in the church. We have seen many struggling couples decide to stay together. It has been a delight to see so many people give their lives to the Lord. We have seen God's faithfulness, guidance, and love and are looking forward to the next sixteen years!

We still have room for teams in April May and June and the first week of July for 2017, and 2018 is wide open.
